Active Allegheny: A Comprehensive Commuter Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation Plan for **Allegheny County**

ActiveAllegheny is the County's first comprehensive active transportation plan with sustainable travel choices for destinations. The plan is a blueprint for improved access and choices to connect people to communities, work sites, transit, schools, attractions and residences. The plan integrates non-vehicular modes of transportation, specifically walking and biking, into our transportation system to increase "livability". Benefits and rewards of active transportation range from: cost savings; low-cost exercise opportunities with healthier lifestyles; a more vibrant, safe community with neighbors-out-on-thestreet and potential for revitalized local business districts: reductions in congestion, air pollutants and greenhouse gas emissions and increases in neighborhood desirability and value.

The plan identifies major arterial bicycle corridors/routes, to facilitate actions by diverse groups to connect from individual neighborhoods to a main network system. Many areas where pedestrian accommodation is desired are identified. The plan is a design resource manual for active transportation initiatives.



The County outlined its first Sustainability Plan in 2009. This first sustainability plan will introduce conceptual framework and action plan for pursuing and achieving the Allegheny Green commitment to reduce our environmental footprint. Each objective entails a wide range of activities and associated metrics. The point is to apply the sustainability concepts against all County operations, and make improvements while maintaining the same level of performance or better, and doing so at a comparable budget level. While certain improvements may require an up-front investment, they should be able to deliver measurable improvements and future cost savings for taxpayers. The sustainability plan aligns closely with the objectives set forth in Allegheny Places, Allegheny County's comprehensive plan.

Among the comprehensive plan's recommendations are:

- Expanding the region's parks and trails system;
- Protecting and enhancing the environment and public health by promoting energy conservation and continuing to improve the County's air quality;
- Eliminating urban, agricultural and industrial pollution runoff to protect streams and watersheds;
- Promoting transit-oriented development at key transit stations and along major transit corridors;
- Promoting the use of green building techniques and energy-efficient housing design; and
- Encouraging developments that will minimize impacts on greenfields

The Allegheny Riverfront Green Boulevard seeks to establish a walkable rail-with-trail green boulevard that accommodates existing Allegheny Valley Railroad freight with regional passenger rail use, as well as additional transportation infrastructure, stormwater management and riverfront habitat restoration. Spearheaded by the City of Pittsburgh, the Urban Redevelopment Authority and Riverlife – and based off of residents' feedback at dozens of public community meetings – the plan offers strategic recommendations to improve riverfront culture, neighborhood connection, and pedestrian and transit opportunities.
