Rivers of Steel Partners with Community Stakeholders to Launch Homestead First Fridays

May 3 inaugural event includes the debut of "Aggregate," an LED light installation at the Bost Building.

Homestead, PA (April 29, 2019)— Rivers of Steel has partnered with local business and artisans in the Homestead community to launch a monthly First Fridays series beginning this May 3, 2019.

To kick-start the season, Rivers of Steel will be debuting *Aggregate*, an LED art installation created by Ian Brill, on May 3 at 8 p.m. at the Bost Building Gallery, 623 East Eighth Avenue, Homestead, PA 15120.

This community effort is a project of the Mon Valley Creative Corridor, an initiative of Rivers of Steel, that aims to strengthen the economic and cultural vitality of the Monongahela Valley by fostering the creative economy, collectively working together with creative professionals, enterprises, and communities to establish the region as a thriving destination – to live, work and play.

In addition to *Aggregate*, Rivers of Steel has multiple presences on Eighth Avenue during the first First Fridays. An exhibition, *From the Vault*, will be on display in the Bost Building Gallery. Notably, *Aggregate* is located in the glass egress stairwell that leads this exhibition in the third-floor gallery. Rivers of Steel is also organizing a street art style exhibition of site-specific murals to be created in the former CVS building at 233 East Eighth Avenue.

- Other art happenings that evening include a pop-up exhibition at 101 East Eighth Ave produced by Associated Artists of Pittsburgh, an exhibition of ceramic art at Eberle Studios, live music at Enix Brewing and Pip & Lola's, live painting at Honest Johns, live axe throwing, kids workshops, open studios and more.
- Rivers of Steel is also partnering with: Voodoo Brewing Co, Arts Excursions Unlimited, Carnegie of Homestead, School House Studios, Mon Valley Initiative and Sign Creators.
- Dates of First Fridays events are May 3, June 7, July 5, August, 2, September 6 & October 4.

These events are a creative placemaking initiative, designed to help fulfill the goal of the Mon Valley Creative Corridor to work within local communities to establish the region as a destination. This work will highlight the main street assets of the community, and it has already generated excitement among our partners.

Rivers of Steel has been invested in this type of main street revitalization in Homestead for 20 years. The restoration of the Bost Building in the early 2000s was one result of this work.

At a time when the focus was on the excitement around the new Waterfront shopping complex, Rivers of Steel had a long view objective for the community's central business street redevelopment.
