Rust Belt Brunch Cruise with Author Paul Hertneky


A Literary, Culinary & Heritage Event on the *Explorer* Riverboat Saturday, March 31, 2018, 10:30 am to 1:30 pm

When author Paul Hertneky released his memoir *Rust Belt Boy: Stories of an American Childhood* in 2016, it was praised from distinguished literary sources coast-to-coast. *The Los Angeles Review* declared "Particularly evocative writing... with beauty and clarity," and *Publisher's Weekly* found the writing to be "...honest, insightful, and empathetic." Through vivid storytelling, Hertneky's essay

collection weaves through time and the smokestacks of Ambridge,

Pa., inviting readers to share childhood experiences that will seem familiar to many locals – the sights and sounds of family gatherings, grandma's kitchen, grandpa's garden, the surrounding woods and the delight of freshly-made *pirohis*.

The excerpts Hertneky will be reading will highlight themes around family and community traditions, life for a youngster in a company town, and a glimpse of characters that inhabited the author's world as a millworker.

MORE ABOUT THE BRUNCH FROM PROHIBITION PASTRIES

A bakery, café, and caterer located in Point Breeze, Prohibition Pastries is the creation of Eliza Jane Bowman. Her food is inspired by "tradition, family, the joy of making something delicious and sharing it with people you love." She cherishes "the amazing scents, fabulous flavors, and that particular satisfaction that arises from creating food that will linger in your memory forever."

The name Prohibition Pastries takes its inspiration of the blending of Bowman's passions – the idea that her delicacies could be infused with the flavors developed through local craft beverages.

The menu created for this program includes:

- Spinach salad with blue cheese, cranberries and candied walnuts
- Signature "Boilermaker" fruit tartlets with Apricot beer glaze and whiskey cream
- Cheddar and chive quiche with a baked pierogie turnover
- Kielbasa with sauerkraut, sautéed onions and apples with sour cream on the side

The buffet-style service will also include a selection of cheeses, nut & poppyseed rolls, along with pretzel chips, soft pretzel rolls, fresh rolls and a potato dish.



MORE ABOUT THE EXPLORER RIVERBOAT

Pittsburgh's premier green riverboat, the 94-foot *Explorer* is offers sightseeing tours, public and student programs, private charters and corporate excursions through Rivers of Steel. Interestingly, *Explorer* is the world's first vessel to have LEED standards applied to its entire engineering and construction process and was designed to host the award-winning environmental education programs offered to K-12 students.

The *Explorer* riverboat docks on Pittsburgh's North Shore, near the headwaters of the Ohio River and adjacent to the Carnegie Science Center. Participants are encouraged to park at the science center's lot and to use the entrance off of Casino Drive (towards the river). The walkway to the Rivers of Steel dock is clearly visible from this entrance. Parking fees are not included in ticket prices. The vessel is temperature controlled, as well as handicapped accessible.

This event will be held rain or shine. In the unlikely event that weather conditions limit the ship's ability to sail, the program will be held at dock.
