- 1. Choose one person from the list.
 - * use a variety of resources to find facts about the person
 - * find facts about:
 - personal life
 - impact on the industry of the region
 - importance to the economy
 - dates, times, places in the person's life
 - * write a three-part report
 - part 1: the personal life of the person
 - part 2: the person's involvement in industry and economy
 - part 3: your opinion of the importance and impact of the
 - person on the industry and economy of the region
- 2. Write a speech about the person.
 - factual information about the person's accomplishments
 - your opinion of the importance and impact of the person
 - * give the speech
 - answer questions from the audience
- 3. Prepare an interview for the person.
 - * prepare questions and answers about the person's accomplishments
 - * prepare an interview between the person and someone else
 - a real person from history
 - a real person from present-day
 - a fictional person
 - * with another student, take the parts of the two characters
 - interview the person from the list
 - ask and answer questions from the points-of-view of the two characters
 - * as a challenge, have the character answer questions about issues related to present-day situations
 - answers should be given and person should remain in character
- 4. Write a newspaper story about the person.
 - * prepare questions and answers about the person
 - * write a newspaper article about the person using facts about the person's life and accomplishments
 - * write a newspaper editorial about the person's accomplishments and his/her impact on industry and the economy



- 5. Choose two of the people from the list.
 - * write questions, answers, and statements from each character's point-of-view
 - * create a conversation between the two characters
 - * with another student, present the conversation
 - * as a challenge, have another student enter the conversation as a present-day, well-known character
- 6. Find a relative or neighbor who worked in the steel industry. Interview the person about his/her work, and the impact of the steel industry on his/her life.
 - * identify where the person worked and for how long
 - * discuss the types of jobs done by the person
 - * discuss the training needed for the job
 - * ask for the person's impressions of the importance of his/her job, and the importance of the steel industry in the development of the region
 - * talk about the problems encountered during the years working in the steel industry
 - * identify the person's membership in, or lack of membership in, the steel workers union
 - * explain the impact of the loss of the steel industry on his/her life, and his/her feelings as to the reasons for the decline of the steel industry
